KEY LICENSES AND PERMITS FOR MOBILE FOOD VENDORS

- Food Truck Permit: Required to legally operate a food truck; issued by the city or county.
- Mobile Vendor Permit: Necessary for selling food from a mobile platform; issued locally.
- **Health Department Permit:** Ensures food safety and sanitation standards; issued by local health departments.
- **Business License:** Grants legal operation of the business; obtained from local business licensing offices.
- Fire Department Inspection Certificate: Confirms compliance with fire safety regulations (e.g., proper fire extinguishers and equipment functionality).
- Employer Identification Number (EIN): Required if you plan to hire employees. This number ensures legal tax filings and compliance.

Additional Requirements:

- **Commissary Agreement:** Contract with a commercial kitchen for food preparation and storage (required in most states).
- Mobile Food Vendor Inspection: Periodic health and safety inspections of the truck.

Issuing Agencies:

- Local city or county health departments
- Fire departments
- Local business licensing offices

Costs:

• Typically range from \$100 to \$1,000 depending on location and scope of the business.

Renewal Frequency:

• Annually: Most permits need to be renewed once a year.
